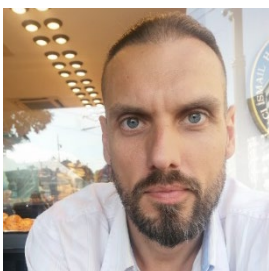

INCLAVI follows [The Strategy for the Rights of Persons with Disabilities 2021-2030](#), which tackles the diverse challenges faced by PwD. It aims to progress on all areas of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, both at EU and Member State levels.

This project is driven by the need to simplify the journey to all passengers, regardless of their disabilities or special conditions. Thanks to this European Union Erasmus+ programme co-funded project, the objectives will be achieved through cooperation among key global industry and labor market actors combined with a world-class Higher Education Institution (HEI) and Vocational Education and Training (VET) consortium.

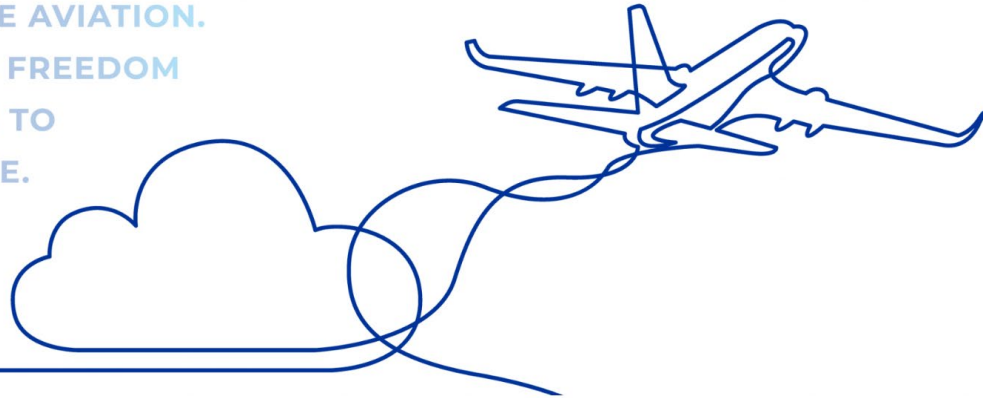
